

Dr. Madaline Harrison is a neurologist specializing in the evaluation and treatment of movement disorders. She directed the Parkinson's Disease and Movement Disorders Division in the UVA Department of Neurology from 2008-2020 and sees patients with Parkinson's disease, Huntington's disease, dystonia, tremor, Tourette's syndrome, and other conditions. She directs the UVA Huntington's Disease Program, an HDSA Center of Excellence since 2000 which provides clinical services well as genetic counseling to patients and families through a multidisciplinary clinic.

In addition to her clinical activities, Dr. Harrison is active in medical education. She is a founding member of the Academy of Distinguished Educators (ADE), now the Academy for Excellence in Education, at the University of Virginia School of Medicine. She has a particular interest in narrative medicine and other arts- based educational techniques. She received a Certificate of Study in Narrative Practice in 2016. Her project for that course was to develop an arts-based curriculum for Neurology residents which has just completed its 5<sup>th</sup> year.
