Medical Misinformation

Public health has a long history of medical *mis*communication and a reliance on non-evidence based and one-size-fits-all approach to messaging. This has contributed to suboptimal vaccination coverage rates, confusion about the safety of vaccine preservatives and waning trust in the medical and scientific establishment among some publics.
