



Poisoning Prevention Matching Game for Kids for up to 20 players

How to play

- Print the 4 "game pieces" pages.
- Cut along the dotted lines to make 16 game pieces.
- Print the *Bingo!* cards. There are 20 total and each is different. Give each player one *Bingo!* card.
- Give each player a pencil OR a handful of chips (see below for ideas).
- Read the Introduction (next page) to the players.
- Randomly choose a game piece. Show it to the players.
- Players who have that image on their *Bingo!* card should mark it out or cover it with a chip.
- When a player has marked or covered 3 images in a row (up and down, side to side, or diagonal) they yell "Bingo!"
- The first person to yell "Bingo!" is the winner. You can also keep playing until everyone has yelled "Bingo!"

*Chip ideas: pennies, legos, dried beans, pebbles, or some other small item.

INTRODUCTION

POISONS are things that can hurt us or make us sick if we eat, drink, or touch them.

Many poisons are things grown-ups use to:

- Clean (like detergent)
- Get rid of pests (like bug spray)
- Care for our homes, our yards, and our cars (like antifreeze)
- Care for our bodies (like mouthwash)


Medicine can make us feel better when we are sick. But if we take too much medicine, or take the wrong medicine, it could be poisonous.

Poisons can be in any room of our house. They can even be in the garage or outside. Some plants, berries, and mushrooms are poisons.

Some poisons might look or smell like food, candy, drinks, or other familiar things that are safe. You have to be very careful! Always ask a grown-up before you eat, drink, or touch something to make sure it is safe.


