According to the most recent <u>Youth Risk Behavior Survey</u> from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), in 2023, 17% of high school students used cannabis, or marijuana, during the past 30 days.

It's more important than ever for parents and caregivers to protect adolescents' health and safety by talking to them about cannabis. As a parent, teacher, coach, or other adult who has a meaningful relationship with an adolescent, your influence is powerful.

We designed this toolkit to give you the most up-to-date, unbiased medical and scientific information possible, as well as guidance from experts in adolescent mental health and development, so that you will feel more confident talking to the young people in your life about cannabis.


