Did you know?

Poisoning is a leading cause of <u>emergency department visits</u> and <u>injury</u> <u>deaths</u> in the U.S. Most poisonings happen in the home from exposures to medicines or to common household products. All ages are at risk.

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Preschool & Kindergarten

WHY ARE THEY AT RISK? Even with coaching, very young children cannot tell the difference between what is safe and what is dangerous. Their natural curiosity leads them to explore cabinets, purses, or drawers where harmful substances may be stored. They put things into the mouth--especially when something looks or smells like a familiar treat. Example: pills look just like candy.

These children rely on adults to create a safer environment where they can play and explore. It is just as important to educate parents and caregivers as the children in your classroom.


Early Elementary Grades

WHY ARE THEY AT RISK? As this age group experiences increasing independence, they may encounter poisons in spaces without close adult supervision. They may lack the knowledge or skills to avoid harm from such potential poisons as cleaning products, medicines, pesticides, even outdoor poisoning risks like plants, mushrooms, snakes, etc.

Middle & High School Grades

WHY ARE THEY AT RISK? Adolescents increasingly spend time apart from adult caregivers. They may use medicines, pesticides, cleaners, and other household chemical products while unsupervised. They may also be exposed to substances of misuse like nicotine, cannabis, alcohol, and prescription drugs.


