Review & approve meeting minutes from October 2019 meeting: Scott motioned for approval and Dianne provided the second.

#### **Research Updates**

- PCORI Leadership Team meeting recap Nov 2019 meeting in Charlottesville  
Scott presented at the symposium, describing the community/UVA partnership work with the PCORI Grant.  
Tobacco Cessation: Zilipah discussed the possibility of using a navigator: ACS in Bristol  
Scott: Educating and evaluating between community and UVA.
  - NIH P30 Supplement: Population Health Assessment in the UVA  
Cancer Center Catchment Area: The initial community surveys are being compiled and will continue to work in conjunction with Massey Cancer Center
  - NIH P30 Supplement: Building Research Capacity to Improve Colorectal Cancer (CRC) Screening in Rural Southwest Virginia Clinics  
Surveys have been completed with Stone Mountain Health Providers and sixty patients to examine colorectal screening. Areas have been identified to improve CRC screening.
  - NIH P01: Cervical cancer self-sampling, HPV vaccines, and tobacco cessation with Stone Mountain Health and Southwest Community Health System

- American Cancer Society (ACS) Grant: Breast Cancer surveying breast imaging centers in central Appalachia to identify best practices
- UVA Cancer Survivorship – weSurvive, Kathleen Porter has completed a pilot group of survivors at Clinch Valley Health, a second group will be recruited through Lewis-Gale Health in Pulaski
- SipSmarter: iSipSmarter internet program to begin in April in conjunction with Mountain Empire Older Citizens, TriArea Health, and Virginia Department of Health
- Kara Wiseman reported that a Tobacco Cessation rural texting program grant has been submitted and will be reviewed in February

- Jennifer Jolliffe reminded everyone of Medicaid open enrollment
- Deb Clarkston: The Virginia Tri College Nursing program will split into separate programs at each of the three regional community colleges
- Lonesome Pie Hospital in Big Stone Gap will offer fifty free colonoscopies
- Jane Roberts from the American Cancer Society mentioned that ACS can provide assistance with transportation and lodging for cancer patients
- Dianne Morris from Mountain Empire Older Citizens said that during the Biden Cancer Summit the possibility of Air bnb assistance for lodging was mentioned and wondered if anyone knew more about it
- Tim Crowder of Bristol Myers Squibb said that clinical trials sites may be a resource for lodging and transportation
