Feedback from Mrinmayee Takle, SMD19:

AAMC Learn Serve Lead in Austin, Texas (Fri, Nov 2- Tues, Nov 6)

- Main OSR Activities were Friday-Sunday
- Various options of sessions to attend, with topics such as advising Medical Students, Medical Student Finance, Diversity and Inclusion, Mental Health
- Networking opportunities to meet students around the country, learn how other medical schools work, etc
- Poster reception from OSR Students regarding medical education, student wellness, curriculum (Ex. Looking at active vs passive learning, looking at Dukes unique schedule and the fact that it doesn't change Step 1 outcomes)
- Book signings (Ex. Grit by Angela Duckworth, In Shock by Rana Awdish)
- Mentorship session for high schoolers/college students interested in medicine, and a separate session for their parents at the Minority Student Medical Career Fair
- General meet and greet sessions for OSR reps from the South and West region

What did I learn?

- OSR is a bigger position at other schools.

- When I asked what other OSRs do at school, they brought up initiatives regarding sitting in on curriculum committees, doing medical education research, and student wellness. Talked about student projects like residency program director panels, political advocacy at the state capital (all things that we already have). Seems like we have all of these things covered, just with other positions and other activities, not necessarily the OSR
- For future years, recommend anyone who is doing medical education research to apply and present at the poster session. UVA will easily fund you, and it's a ton of fun and great networking! Also recommend both the 4th year and non-4th year rep to go next year because it's a great experience, plus UVA will fund you, give you time off, and great for your resume. Maybe some involvement on the national level if you're interested, too
- I think it would be a good idea to change the non-4th year rep position to 1st year rep. It would be great to have the two OSRs from UVA to attend the conference next year. 4th years can make it because it's interview season (I made it work, even with an interview on Friday). 2nd and 3rd years in general would have a tough time because Step is coming up for the 2nd years and 3rd years are in clerkships, just a thought/potential change for future years. Other schools have one OSR per year, and they actually send all four years to these conferences, really giving students a chance at national elections, which would be awesome if we could get on the national board too!

AAMC OSR Representative position description:

The AAMC Organization of Student Representatives (OSR) Representatives (2) shall

1. Be one 4th year student and one alternate 2nd or 3rd year student elected in the spring who will serve a one-year term. The alternate AAMC OSR Representative will accompany the OSR Representative, in an unofficial capacity, to regional and national meetings.
2. Represent the Society, along with the alternate, with a list of school's issues at the OSR regional and national meetings.
3. Submit a written report to the Council and Dean of the School of Medicine concerning activities of the OSR representative and alternate at national and regional meetings in a timely fashion.

4. Work with the Council in matters pertaining to the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME).
5. Act as a resource and liaison for students by informing them of AAMC national priorities, opportunities, services, and programs of mutual interest.
6. Administer the Arnold P. Gold Foundation Humanism in Medicine Award nomination process.
