Academic Conferences

1. Fellow Presented conferences

Clinical Case Conference

The fellow will choose a challenging case (clinic, inpatient) and generate several clinical questions. The goal is to use evidence based data to answer clinical questions. (please refer to core curriculum topics that should be covered during Fellow's conferences) Day/Location: Friday, 2:00pm. Pediatric Conference room, Old Medical School Building.

Morbidity and Mortality Conference

The fellows are expected to present the clinical outcomes and complications of patients under the care of the GI Division staff. Systems and judgment errors are reviewed in a constructive and positive manner in an effort to continually improve clinical decision-making. Plans are developed to implement new procedures and policies to circumvent similar errors / complications in the future. Individual judgment errors are addressed as necessary by the faculty and Program Director.

Day/Location: Friday, 2:00pm. Pediatric Conference room, Old Medical School Building.

Best Practice Conference

The fellow will choose a topic (please refer to core curriculum topics that should be covered during Fellow's conferences) and discuss evidence practice guidelines. Fellow should be able to develop a proposed guideline and/or algorithm based on the evidence discussed.

Journal Club

Fellow are required to choose an article from a peer reviewed journal. Article will be discussed with faculty members. The goal is to improve critique skills, keep up to date with most recent published data and discuss application for clinical practice.

Pathology Conference

This conference meets monthly. Fellows and faculty members of the Division of Gastroenterology and a member of the Department of Pathology review specific cases and biopsy or pathology specimen. Fellows are expected to discuss the case and present gross findings on endoscopy when pertinent.

Radiology Conference

This conference meets monthly. Fellow must prepare a list of interesting/challenging cases to be discussed in a multidisciplinary meeting with radiologist. During conference fellow will provide an overview of the case with pertinent clinical information.

Day/Location: Third Tuesday of the month, 4:00pm. Radiology Conference room, Main Hospital.

Motility Conference

This conference meets 2-3 times per year. Fellow prepares a list of interesting/challenging cases to be discussed in a multidisciplinary meeting with CHKD Motility Faculty. During conference fellow will provide an overview of the case with pertinent clinical information. Day/Location: TBD

Methods of Evaluation for Fellows

In order for the gastroenterology training program to assess its ability to achieve the goals and objectives, an evaluation process is in place that includes faculty, staff, and observation, and review of in training examination results.

1. Global assessment

Semi-annually, fellows meet individually with the Program Director to formally review their evaluations. Evaluations are based on Pediatric Subspecialty Milestones developed by the ACGME and Academy of Pediatrics. Milestones are knowledge, skills, attitudes, and other attributes for each of the ACGME competencies organized in a developmental framework from less to more advanced. The Pediatrics Subspecialty Milestones are designed to describe changes in observable attributes of the learner across the continuum of medical education from residency through fellowship into practice. 2. Monthly Feedback sessions with Program Director Monthly, fellows will meet with Program Director for an informal feedback session. This meeting is an informal session to provide the fellow with immediate feedback as per their performance during their inpatient rotation, inpatient rotation and procedure skills within the last month and to provide strategies for improvement.

3. Weekly Feedback Session with Faculty

Weekly, fellows will meet briefly with the attending on service. This meeting is to provide the fellow with immediate feedback as per their performance during the inpatient service week and to discuss strategies for improvement.

4. Written examination

All fellows participate in the annual In Training Examination offered by the American Board of Pediatrics. The results are reviewed and an individualized program of instruction and learning is developed based upon the fellows' performance.
