#### vietnam. An Ecological-Economic Exploration

This January, I traveled with a group of UVA students and faculty to Vietnam as a part of the GSVS 4810/LPPS 5550 J-Term, Vietnam: An Ecological-Economic Exploration. As an MPH student in the Health Policy, Ethics, and Law concentration, I was able to take this course as one of my program electives. The group traveled through three major cities in Vietnam over the course of 15 days, learning about Vietnam's economy and environment through once-in-a-lifetime hands-on activities and meetings with Vietnamese experts. During our first stop to Ho Chi Minh City, we learned about the continued impact of the Vietnam War on biodiversity in the Mekong Delta, planting mangrove trees in the Cần Giờ Bioreserve where most of the forest had previously been lost to chemical defoliants like Agent Orange. We later dove into food systems — harvesting our own coffee with the instruction of members of the K'ho ethnic minority group and WWOOFing during our farm-to-table day in Hanoi.

"Lunch and learn" meetings with entrepreneurs and NGO representatives, a day cruise in Ha Long Bay, and volunteering alongside Vietnamese college students from Keep Vietnam Clean to reduce plastic waste entering Hanoi's West Lake during Kitchen God Day festivities were among the many other highlights of the trip. Learning about a wide range of social and economic factors that influence health alongside a group of students with diverse interests — sustainability, policy, engineering, etc. — was an incredible experience that I will not soon forget! --Lindsay Graham, MPH Student

Dr. Balkrishnan Visits Nepal to Jumpstart Research on Air Pollution and Environmental Health

Dr. Rajesh Balkrishnan, Professor of Public Health Sciences at UVA, recently visited Nepal to jumpstart research related to reducing the effects of air pollution on environmental health in Nepal. He was assisted by Ankit Dakhal, PhD student in Chemical Engineering at UVA. The Environmental Resilience Institute supports this research by bringing together
