
# Alumni Spotlight

# MPH 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

This year marks the **20**<sup>th</sup> **anniversary of UVA's MPH program**, a milestone highlighting two decades of advancing health equity and shaping public health leaders. Since its launch in 2004, the program has grown exponentially, with over **600 alumni** working across Virginia and beyond. Current program director Aaron Pannone, PhD, credits the program's growth to rising awareness of public health's importance. "There's a greater understanding now of the social determinants of health...COVID also increased interest," he notes.

The program offers both an intensive one-year option or a three- to four-semester track. With flexible learning options and a focus on interdisciplinary education, students are provided with the flexibility to align their education with their career goals. This year, the program welcomed 54 new students, continuing its growth trajectory from 48 graduates in the 2023-2024 academic year.

In February of 2024, Matthew Gurka, PhD, re-joined the Department of Public Health Sciences as Chair, succeeding Ruth Bernheim, JD, MPH, who held the position from 2010-2024. His goals for the program emphasize the need for continued innovation for continuous growth. "The data we use to improve outcomes and inform policy are becoming larger and more complex, and tools like AI allow us to use these data in powerful ways. At the same time, communicating important public health messaging is more and more challenging," Gurka adds.

As the UVA MPH program celebrates **two decades of excellence**, it remains committed to individualized, interdisciplinary education and to fostering a vibrant public health community – one that is prepared to meet the evolving needs of the field.

Our first major initiative – the Haven Supply Drive – collected essential items like toiletries, socks, and winter clothing for a local homeless shelter.

**Social Subcommittee**: This group focuses on creating spaces for students to relax and form lasting connections. From casual meetups to festive end-of-semester celebrations, these events aim to foster friendships and promote a sense of community among students – something we've all missed after the disruptions of recent years.

The Delta Omega Honorary Society in Public Health was founded in 1924 at Johns Hopkins University within the School of Hygiene and Public Health to promote the graduate study of public health, and to recognize outstanding achievement in the new field.
