WAYS YOU CAN SUPPORT UVA RADIOLOGY ON DOXIMITY

Doximity is an online networking platform for medical professionals that has become a powerful source for ranking both hospitals and residency programs. Physician surveys on Doximity now contribute significantly to a hospital's ranking in the **U.S. News & World Report's** annual Best Hospital rankings. And Doximity completes its own rankings of residency programs which are widely referenced by potential trainees.

We want the hard work of our faculty and trainees to be showcased and we want the quality of our programs to be reflected accurately in these national rankings.

In order for our department and educational programs to succeed, we need your help.

There are three ways you can support UVA Radiology using Doximity:

1. Register on Doximity.com and complete your profile.

Doximity data now automatically feeds into *U.S. News & World Report* rankings as well as Doximity's own ranking systems. As an alumni or current/former faculty member, it is critically important that you claim your Doximity profile and fill out as much information as possible, including education, work history and publications.

Visit doximity.com to register and update your profile.



2. Vote for UVA Health in the 2023-2024 U.S. News & World Report's Best Hospitals Expert Opinion survey.

Each year *U.S. News & World Report* releases its "Best Hospitals" and "Best Children's Hospitals" rankings. A significant factor in these rankings is reputation, as determined by a survey of board-certified physicians in each of adult and pediatric specialties ranked by *U.S. News and World Report.* These surveys are now completed through Doximity.

All physicians who are board-certified in these specialties and have claimed Doximity profiles will be invited to vote in the survey on Doximity. The voting window is only open for a very short time, so please vote for the University of Virginia Medical Center and University of Virginia Children's Hospital (as eligible) before the window for the 2023-2024 survey closes.

Look for an email from Doximity with a link inviting you to take the survey. If you do not receive an email, visit doximity.com, log-in and click on the U.S. News logo on your homepage.

3. Complete any additional Doximity surveys you receive in regards to your residency experience or clinical training.

If you have graduated from one of our residency programs in the last 10 years, you may receive one or more additional surveys on Doximity about your residency and/or clinical training experience. Please complete any surveys you receive and help UVA Radiology's residency programs be accurately reflected in national rankings.
