# A Tribute to Eduard

We are saddened to share that Dr. Eduard de Lange passed away peacefully at his home on May 24, losing his battle with prostate cancer.

Dr. de Lange was born and raised in the Netherlands, where he completed his MD at the University of Leiden. After finishing 18 months of training, Dr. de Lange and his family moved to Africa so he could serve as the sole physician in a small Ghanaian village hospital. Twenty-five months later, he returned home to the Netherlands and completed a radiology residency, influenced by the potential he saw with a new imaging tool: Magnetic Resonance Imaging.

Dr. de Lange first visited UVA while he was in the United States to study at the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology. While in Charlottesville, Department Chair Ted Keats, MD invited him to work as a radiologist at the university for a year. Dr. de Lange began his appointment in 1983 and never left, as he continued to delve deeper into the still-developing subject of MRI.

At UVA, Dr. de Lange soon became an expert in the

field. Serving as UVA's Department Director of MRI, he was an investigator on 14 NIH-funded grants and more than 20 industry-sponsored trials involving MRI. His work led to more than 200 manuscripts and two books, as well as an MRI physics lecture series for the department's residents.

Dr. de Lange's impact continued even after his retirement in 2017. As professor emeritus, he continued to intermittently help out the department by reading complex hepatobiliary and pancreatic MRIs through 2022. He and his wife, Francesca, also endowed the UVA Radiology Residency Diversity and Inclusion Fund, which supports the growth of diversity and inclusion in radiology and medical imaging — at UVA but also within radiology as a whole.

In addition to Dr. de Lange's contributions to the department and the field, those who knew him will remember his generous spirit and genuine kindness. Members across the department and beyond will miss this very special person, colleague, and friend.


